

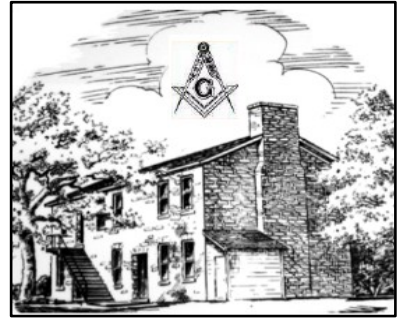

For those that don't know, August 4th is a special day in Masonry. In 1753, Brother George Washington was raised as a Master Mason at Fredericksburg Lodge in Fredericksburg, Virginia. He

was 21 years old. Bro. Washington believed that becoming a Mason gave him an opportunity to demonstrate his belief in civil service and responsibility. When Bro. Washington was inaugurated as the first President of the United States in 1789 he was also serving as Worshipful Master of Alexandria Lodge.

In 1922, a Masonic memorial to Washington was proposed on a 36-acre tract of land, situated on a hilltop in Alexandria, Virginia. It is said that Thomas Jefferson first proposed the building site for America's Capitol. During the building of the Memorial, even during the Great Depression, no loans were taken - only contributions from Masons. This tradition continues today, as all Entered Apprentices in Texas contribute a portion of their Initiation fee to the maintenance of the Washington Memorial. This donation is commemorated with a certificate, presented to the new Brother after the close of their Initiation. The work on the Memorial continued until it was opened to the public in 1970. In 1999, a large Square and Compass was added to the front lawn, which easily communicates the builders of the Memorial and the namesake it preserves. There are many artifacts of American and Masonic history at the Memorial, including those of Bro. Washington, which are on display to the public.

Our Fraternity has a rich history and deep traditions. I have to occasionally remind myself to pause and reflect on why practicing the principles of the Order are so important. It's why being mindful of my thoughts, words, and behavior is necessary. It's because I not only represent myself, and my Brethren, when I leave the Lodge and move about society. I also represent men whose distinguished service built a foundation that our entire Nation is built upon, not just our gentle Fraternity.

Have a terrific month – stay cool and hydrated – and be well this month. See you at lodge!

Our ritual's contents were, and are, living, breathing truths which are conveyed in words, actions, and symbols which by their antiquity prove that they are best for the purpose.

The First Documented Initiation of a Freemason

Elias Ashmole, a chemist and antiquarian, recorded the proceedings of his initiation in his diary, where he used to write notes about his life with the intention of writing an autobiography. This entry, written in October of 1646, is important because it is the first evidence known of the making of a speculative Mason, and the first one to be recorded in writing.

Elias Ashmole is not the first speculative Mason in history, but he is the first one who recorded the proceedings of his initiation in writing (or at least his is the first record that was ever found), and he even took down the names of the other Masons that were present during his initiation.

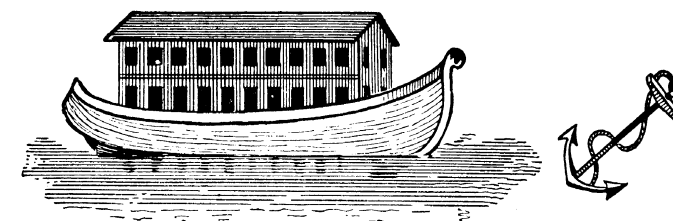
