

- October 30th, 1937, Lyndon B. Johnson (U.S. President 1963-1969) received his 1st degree in Texas.

So, honor the lambskin, may it always remain Forever unblemished, and free from all stain, And when we are called to the Great Father's love, May we all take our place in that Lodge up above.


